

## BASIC NEEDS

In 2018, almost \$400,000 was invested in providing basic needs for families. These grants assist with more immediate, short-term, yet critical needs in our community. This funding often helps the most vulnerable populations, including fixed/low income individuals and families, and those experiencing a temporary crisis.



Agencies providing the following services may apply for funding under the Basic Needs category:

- Toiletries
- Transportation assistance
- Food bank services
- Hunger relief services; both pantry and prepared meal services
- Emergency and basic, rather than ongoing and comprehensive, healthcare, dental care, and prescriptions
- Emergency assistance programs that provide materials or financial assistance
- Short-term housing and/or shelter for those experiencing homelessness
- Emergency or short-term shelter for survivors of domestic violence
- Utility Assistance
- Birth certificate and driver's licenses/state ID cards programs
